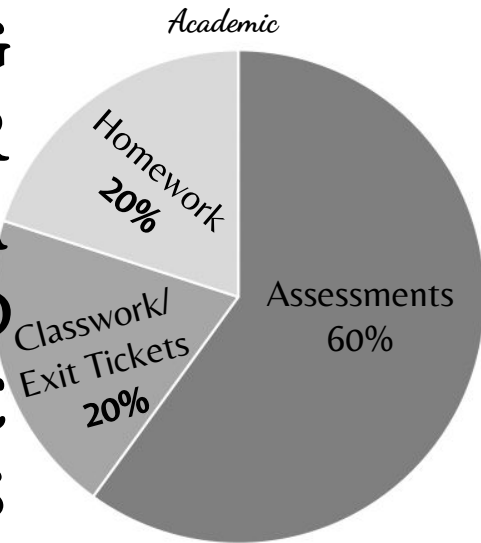

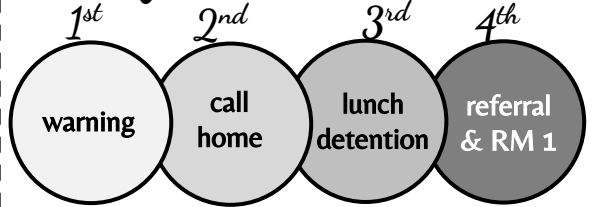
Consequences

Students whose habits foster a positive learning environment or who make significant improvements will earn a phone call home or class dojo text message.

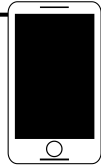
Consequence System



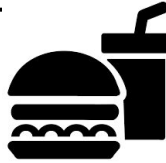
Classroom Expectations

Trash cans are provided on both sides of the classroom. You must clean up after yourself.

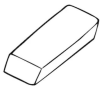


There will be no bathroom passes. Exceptions will be made only for health conditions.
